## **Talk About the Bible Story**

#### ENGAGE IN EVERYDAY MOMENTS TOGETHER



## **Morning Time**

When you go into your child's room, cuddle them and say: "Good morning, [child's name]! Are you ready to be a friend to everyone today? You can share, say kind words, and help others. These are great ways to be a friend, and being a friend is one way Jesus shows us how to love others!"



### **Drive Time**

While on the go, look for cars that are different, animals that are different, buildings, flowers, etc. Talk about how God made people different from one another. Jesus showed Peter how to love people who were different than him, and Jesus shows us how to love people who are different from us too.



#### **Cuddle Time**

Cuddle with your child and pray:
"Dear God, Jesus is the best friend
we could ever have. Jesus listens to
us. He helps us. He cares for us and
shows us how to love others. Please
help us be a friend to one another the
way Jesus shows us."



#### **Bath Time**

Add bubbles and a few toy friends to bath time. Make a big heart with bubbles. Say: "Find everyone and put them inside the heart." Each time your child finishes putting all of the toys in the heart, say: "Jesus showed Peter that loving like Jesus means loving everyone."
